Led by the Metro Chamber, 400+ Local Business Leaders, Electeds & Changemakers Leave for Washington D.C. This Week for 51st Annual “Cap-to-Cap” Advocacy Effort

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – Produced by the Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce, a local contingent of more than 400 regional business leaders, elected officials and changemakers will head to Washington D.C. later this week to attend the 51st Annual Capitol-to-Capitol (or Cap-to-Cap) federal advocacy effort on April 22-26, 2023. A powerful and impactful institution since 1970, Cap-to-Cap filled up at a record pace earlier this year and includes nearly 110 elected officials and more than 100 first-time participants. The purpose of the annual advocacy program is to meet with federal officials to collectively and effectively champion a successful future for the region.

Representing the largest and longest-standing regional chamber delegation of its kind, Cap-to-Cap continues to drive steady and consistent advocacy that results in significant advances for business development, an inclusive economy, and a vibrant and connected region. Each year the delegation from the capital region includes an influential group of business leaders who unite to advocate and stand for policies that help ensure the region is poised for growth and greater success.

2023 Cap-to-Cap attendees will be introduced to policy experts focused on our region’s priorities and will have the opportunity to add thoughtful insight while helping to identify solutions that address the most pressing issues facing the greater Sacramento area.
